Have a good weekend.








This week our class spotlight is on EYFS

We have had a great start to the Summer term in EYFS. We have been busy looking at our class text called 'Tad'. Tad is a tadpole who turns into a frog. We have been learning about animal life cycles and we have enjoyed using different media to create observational drawings of Tad and Big Blub. You have impressed us Reception this week with your understanding of the teens numbers. We have been using the star words of tens, ones and patterns. Keep shining EYFS!

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
This week our subject spotlight is Science

In science this term, Reception have been looking at the life-cycle of a frog, which is linked to their class reading book 'Tad'. Year1, are continuing to identify the different types of animals. They found out that some reptiles can shed then regrow their tails if caught by a predator. Year 2, have been discussing why animals move from place to place and this links with Year 4's work on food chains. They have been learning about producers and consumers within a chain. Year 3, have been looking at how plants grow in different environments. They have discovered that plants that grow near the Equator have buttress roots as the soil is very moist. Year 6, are comparing Darwin and Wallace's theories of evolution. Ask them which they think is the better theory.
