Year 2

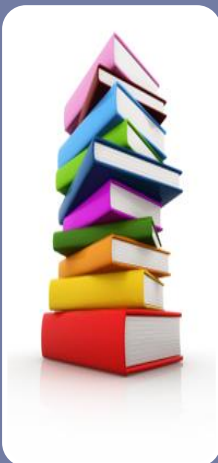
I liked maths this week. I have been learning about multiplication and division, by putting objects into groups. (Frankie)

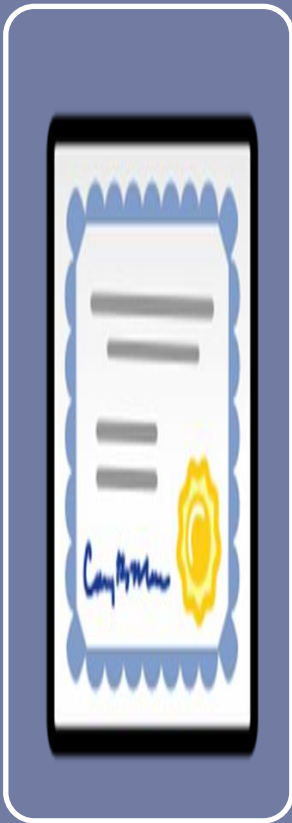
